DuWayne was born August 22, 1958, in Prattville, Alabama, which he still calls home. He is single, 5'9" and weighs 150 lbs. He lives with proud mom and dad, Mr. and Mrs. James Middlebrook and according to dad, DuWayne has two interests—racing and chasing. Racing cars and chasing girls. James Middlebrook spoke proudly of his son and laughs a little, too, recalling DuWayne's first season in 1980. Starting his racing career in the Street Division at M.I.S. in a 1970 Roadrunner. He had his eyes set on two straight championships, and with the determination of a champion, stayed on top to become No. 1 again in 1983.
